

Great Off-Land Fishing Spots!

Residents of Tradewinds can fish and crab at the Common Fishing Pier on the River at the very end of S. Amstel Road. The Fishing Pier is the one on the left with the railing. Be safe! Also...

- 1. Citrus County covered fishing pier at Fort Island Trail Park.
- 2. Citrus County fishing pier at Fort Island Beach. (if the repairs from the hurricane have been completed)
- 3. Multiple covered fishing piers on the south side of the barge canal Withlacoochee Bay Trail. (there are also multiple places to park next to the canal to fish from your vehicle next to the rocks... as well as several primitive places to park and fish on the north side of the barge canal)
- 4. Very west end of SR 40 in Yankeetown, fish from the bank where the Withlacoochee River meets the Gulf)
- 5. Covered fishing docks on Lake Rousseau at Inglis Dam Recreation Area. (you can also fish from the rocks below the dam)
- 6. For 75 years folks have fished from the Gospel Island Rd. bridge between Lake Henderson and little Lake Henderson, next to downtown Inverness.
- 7. Small fishing pier on little Lake Spivey at Eden Park, south side of Inverness.
- 8. almost forgot... you can also fish on the Withlacoochee River at Citrus County Spruce Park at CR39 out by Stump Knockers on the river.
- 9. AND the end of Turner Camp Rd. at the county park and boat ramp there.
